This Sunday, we are being reminded of both the importance of hospitality and the need to focus on God Alone. In the first reading, Abraham sets about serving the three persons loaves of bread, meat from his finest calf, cream, and milk. He gives them (God) all his attention, care, and service.

Similarly, in the Gospel, there is a great flurry of activity and service as Martha and Mary welcome Jesus into their home. However, there is one important distinction here. While Martha is busy and fretting over many things, Mary sits at the feet of Jesus, listening and giving him all of her attention. And this is the invitation to each of us. God invites us to put him at the centre of our lives and very being. In all we're doing, and being, is God the one and only one at the heart of our lives, from which all else flows? Where is our attention? Who is the centre of our lives?

First Reading - Genesis 18:1-10 ·

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the around. 'My lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.' Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah.' 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. 'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent' he replied. Then his quest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail, and your wife will then have a son.'
