One of the most important and deep-seated questions humans ask is, 'Will I be saved?' This is expressed in other ways, like 'Is heaven real? How will I enter it? In fact, almost all religions speak of offering salvation.

Who will be saved? Through a parabolic teaching, Jesus, in today's Gospel, warns those who think that entry into the kingdom is through 'ascription', that is, the assignment of status through kinship ties. The Jews may be the chosen people, children of Abraham, but their salvation is far from assured. Jesus' parable of the Narrow Door emphasises that entry in to the kingdom is based not on ascription but on performance. The authentic response to Jesus' teaching entails both hearing and doing. The true disciple is one who hears the word of God and puts it into practise, bearing the fruit of repentance and good deeds. To the question of whether only a few will be saved, Jesus pictures a multitude 'from east and west, from the north and the south' reclining at the banquet in God's kingdom. Luke refers to the ingathering of the Jews from the diaspora in the eschatological times (Isaiah 43:5; Zechariah 8:7) and adds the ingathering of the Gentiles to stress the theme of universalism. The coming of the Gentiles is not a rejection of the Jews. But Jesus disabuses the Jews, especially their religious leaders, of the idea that they can rely on their status as children of the kingdom. Salvation is God's gift freely given to the Israelites, and now to the Gentiles. The Jews should welcome the kingdom with gratitude and humility, and not as something due them because of their ties with Abraham.

Entrance Antiphon - Cf. Ps 85: 1-3

Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

First Reading - Isaiah 66:18-21 ·

The Lord says this: I am coming to gather the nations of every language. They shall come to witness my glory. I will give them a sign and send some of their survivors to the nations: to Tarshish, Put, Lud, Moshech, Rosh, Tubal, and Javan, to the distant islands that have never heard of me or seen my glory. Second Reading - Hebrews 12:5-7,11-13 ·

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

Gospel - Luke 13:22-30

Through towns and villages Jesus went teaching, making his way to Jerusalem. Someone said to him, 'Sir,

will there be only a few saved?' He said to them, 'Try your best to enter by the narrow door, because, I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed. 'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'

Inner North Assembly – save the date!

Would you like to meet with others across our inner north Catholic community to pray and discern how to build a sense of belonging and deepen our faith and share it with others? You are warmly invited to take up this opportunity. When: Saturday, 27 September 2025, 10am – 3.30pm. Where: Australian Catholic University, Watson.

The assembly will be preceded by 9am Mass at Holy Rosary Church and follows Pope Leo's greetings to Rome and the world on 8 May when he emphasised the need to look for 'ways to be a missionary Church, a Church that builds bridges and encourages dialogue' and to be a synodal Church. Synodality in this context is a 'walking together' that Pope Francis explained as a 'respectful, mutual listening, free of ideology and predetermined agendas'.

In For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission – Final Document (26 October 2024), synodality is explained as 'primarily a spiritual disposition [permeating] the daily life of the Baptised as well as every aspect of the Church's mission' (para 43). A synodal spirituality flows from the action of the Holy Spirit. In Pope Francis's words: 'the Holy Spirit is a sure guide and our first task is to learn how to discern his voice, since he speaks through everyone and in all things'.
