Who are we as we come before God today? Poor, humble, weak, broken-hearted, ill, exhausted, in need of God's mercy? God's mercy? God's face is always turned towards such people. In the Mass today, the penitential rite is a great opportunity to stand in that place of humility with the tax-collector. Presiders sometimes use their words to introduce the prayers of mercy. I have heard one ask us to come to our God of love and compassion 'for forgiveness of our sins, for peace in our hearts and for healing in our lives'. Another calls us to 'reflect on our need for healing in our relationships with God, others, ourselves and our environment'. The penitential rite is a great equaliser and reality-check; we can all recognise aspects of ourselves that are rough or broken. We come to receive Jesus' gift of himself in Communion not because we are perfect, but because we are in need of him. He wants to feed and nourish us because we are hungry and thirsty. If we come to him full of ourselves, we may not appreciate this gift and we may leave unchanged. So let us be open to God's mercy and healing today.

Monday 20th October 2025 marked 90-years since the consecration of St. Patricks Church/School in 1935

On Sunday 19th October Archbishop Prowse, assisted by Fr. Bernie Patterson, celebrated Mass acknowledging the anniversary. On Monday 20th, Fr. Sebastian and Fr. Thon celebrated Mass for the weekday congregation. Both Masses, attended by past teachers, pupils and parishioners, were followed by refreshments and the cutting of the anniversary cakes.

Memorabilia, photos and stories tracing the 90-year history of the Church and school were displayed in the Church.
