The Baptism of the Lord

Today, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, we stand at a turning point in the life of Jesus and in the life of the Church. The Christmas season draws to a close, and we begin to follow Christ as He steps into His public ministry. At the Jordan River, something extraordinary takes place—yet it happens in a moment of quiet humility.

Jesus approaches John not as a judge or a king, but as one among the people. Though He is without sin, He enters the waters of repentance. In doing so, He fully embraces our human condition. Jesus does not remain distant from our struggles; instead, He steps into them. His baptism tells us that God chooses closeness over power, humility over glory.

As Jesus rises from the water, the heavens are opened. The Spirit descends like a dove, and the voice of the Father is heard: “You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased.” In this moment, the mystery of the Holy Trinity is revealed. More than that, we are shown who Jesus truly is—the Son sent by the Father, anointed by the Spirit for the work of salvation.

But this feast is not only about Jesus. It is also about us. Through our own baptism, we have been united to Christ. The same Spirit that descended upon Jesus now dwells within us. The same Father who called Jesus “beloved” now calls each of us His beloved sons and daughters.

The Baptism of the Lord challenges us to remember who we are and whose we are. It calls us to live out our baptismal identity with humility, obedience, and trust in God’s plan. Like Jesus, we are sent—not necessarily to great public moments, but to daily faithfulness, quiet acts of love, and courageous witness to the Gospel.

As we move into Ordinary Time, may we not think of it as ordinary at all. It is the time to live what we have received. Strengthened by our baptism, may we follow Christ with renewed hearts, confident that the heavens remain open and that God continues to say to each of us: “You are my beloved.”

Entrance Antiphon **cf. Mt 3: 16-17**

After the Lord was baptised, the heaven were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.

my chosen one in whom my soul delights.

he will neither waver, nor be crushed
until true justice is established on earth,
for the islands are awaiting his law.
I, the Lord, have called you to serve
the cause of right;
I have taken you by the hand and formed you;
I have appointed you as covenant of the people
and light of the nations,
to open the eyes of the blind,
to free captives from prison,
and those who live in darkness
from the dungeon.

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.

'It is true, God sent his word to the people of Israel, and it was to them that the good news of peace was brought by Jesus Christ - but Jesus Christ is Lord of

all men. You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.'

The heavens were opened and the Father's voice was heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him.

Gospel **Matthew 3: 13-17**

Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. John tried to dissuade him. 'It is I who need baptism from you,' he said 'and yet you come to me!' But Jesus replied, 'Leave it like this for the time being; it is fitting that we should, in this way, do all that righteousness demands.' At this, John gave in to him.

As soon as Jesus was baptised he came up from the water, and suddenly the heavens opened and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming down on him. And a voice spoke from heaven, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on him.'
